New Sermon Series begins this Sunday, January 12th



May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

(Romans 15:13 – NIV)

For each of the last three years, the Lord has put a verse on my heart that has become a theme for me and my ministry. In 2018, that verse was Isaiah 43:19, "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland." For 2019, the verse was the ending of Isaiah 56:7, "...for my house will be called a house of prayer for all nations."

The Lord gave me this year's verse for 2020 the first week in December. It's the above quote from Romans 15:13. And at the time, the word that I thought was going to be the emphasis was "overflow." The image of being so filled by God that we overflow into the lives of those around us is still one I will be teaching, preaching, but more importantly living in the year and the years ahead. But as I write this in the second week of 2020, the word that the Holy Spirit is emphasizing to me is "hope."

There are so many levels on which hope is needed. I don't know about you, but I need more hope in my personal life. As I listen to the news, it's clear that the world needs hope more than it ever has, and that is one reason why each of us needs to "overflow with hope." And our congregation needs hope. But notice that the hope comes as "the God of hope" fills us with joy and peace. And how are we filled? By trusting in God.

As I write this, news has hit on local and national media outlets, Facebook, twitter and email that the United Methodist Church has split or divided. Some local TV outlets went so far as to falsely declare that Asbury United Methodist Church has left the denomination. To paraphrase Mark Twain, "The reports of the United Methodist Church's death has been greatly exaggerated."

What did happen this past Friday (Jan 3) was that an ad hoc group of 16 persons that include 8 bishops and 8 leaders from progressive and traditional groups in our denomination released a statement. In this statement, these 16 persons agreed to a mediated protocol that would allow the amicable split of annual conferences and congregations that wish to maintain the traditional stance on homosexuality from the United Methodist Church.

Although this group was made up of influential persons in our denomination, it has no authority. The document simply contains a mediated agreement that the group has agreed to support as legislation is developed for the 2020 General Conference to be held in May. But once the legislation is properly placed before the General Conference, it will still be subjected to amendments, changes, additions, and deletions as it is debated and discussed by the General Conference delegates. All this to say that there is still a long and complicated process for this protocol to be adopted by the General Conference, if it is adopted at all.

So what is the bottom line for Will Rogers UMC? First, I will host a Q & A session during the Sunday school hour in the food court on January 19, 2020 from 9:35 to 10:30 am. I will give more details about the process of General Conference and answer the questions I can about our denomination, annual conference, and local church moving forward.

Second, Will Rogers will keep doing what Will Rogers has done for 76 years: make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. For the source of our hope is not found in any protocol or legislation. It is found in the God of Hope filling us with all joy and peace as we trust in him. Third, pray, listen, and participate. Pray for the leadership of our church to help us all seek a faithful way forward. Listen to with love and grace to friends, family, small groups, and Sunday school friends. We will not all share the same opinion about what should happen next, so let us all remain calm and open to the movement of the Holy Spirit. And finally participate in the ongoing life of Will Rogers. If you are not here, then the body of Christ as a whole is diminished. Nothing that has happened in the past seven days or seventy years should stop the people of Will Rogers from "overflowing with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."

This week we looked at whatever happened to the 11 Apostles after Jesus returned to heaven. Basically, we only know that we are told all but one died rather than back down on their faith. Scripture only tells us of what happened to Judas, who betrayed Christ, he committed suicide, and James the son of Zebedee who was killed by King Herod. According to traditions all but John were martyred for their beliefs. Most of us have heard teachings that claim the fact they were martyred prove the validity of what they preached, however, there are many religions, past and present whose followers are killed for their beliefs. The fact that they were willing to die and the drastic change from cringing cowards to bold and fearless witnesses who spread across the world the news that Jesus rose from the dead. Their faith was not based on second hand testimony but on the belief that they had seen the resurrected Christ with their own eyes. From the Apostles forward, there is no evidence for an early Christian community that did not have belief in the resurrection as its core belief. We see that in the early Christian creeds and writings of the Apostles and early church Fathers. We will continue to explore what happened to the 11 who walked and talked with Jesus.
